

HEALTH CONDITIONS

VETERINARIAN: Champ du Perier Equine Clinic

Inspection upon arrival

As part of health safety procedures at the EQUITA LYON exhibition, free and mandatory clinical examinations are systematically conducted on the arrival of the equines at the Eurexpo venue.

Equines must be presented in good overall condition and must have the elements listed below.

If the clinical examination is debatable, the animal may be placed in quarantine boxes outside the exhibition, and in more severe cases, entry to the exhibition may be refused.

If additional examinations are required to guide the decision to authorize entry to the exhibition, these will be at your expense and must be paid for on site.

Veterinarians and the Organising Committee reserve the right to exclude any horse which does not meet these conditions.

Mandatory elements

For all horses

- **The equine identification papers with the outline diagram** and/or description issued by an approved veterinarian or a studbook agent or provisional certificate for those waiting for the definitive description of the studbook.
- **An electronic transponder.**
- **Type 2 certificate*** for the means of transport of horses for transports longer than 8 hours.
- **Certificate of competence*** for the person driving the horses (CAPTAV for France).

** In case of a visit from the Direction Départementale de la Protection des Populations du Rhône (DDPP), these documents may be requested.*

Equines stationed in France

- **A health certificate** from the licensed veterinarian of the departure farm stating that the horses or equine species being exhibited have been free for at least 30 days of clinical signs of any Category 1 infectious disease (Equine Infectious Anemia, West Nile Disease, African horse sickness). It must include the order number of the veterinarian, the address of the horses' usual place of residence, the name and SIRE number or transponder of the horse(s) concerned by the certificate.

Equines from foreign countries

- A copy of the pedigree and zootechnical certificate issued by the country of origin and endorsed by the authorities (**see Article D653-111 of the French Rural Code**):
 - ⇒ **Intra EEC:** Certificate from the TRACE NT system

 - ⇒ **Outside the EEC GRAND EXPORT:** comply with the legislation and regulation of the country of origin in correlation with the French systems: vaccination, transport documents, sanitary protocol (possible obligation of quarantine), customs protocol (ATA carnet or temporary admission).

Equine flu vaccination is mandatory: the "vaccination" sheet should include a stamp from a veterinarian who is not the owner of the animal.

1. For all horses whose primary vaccination was administered before 1st January 2013:

- a) Primary vaccination comprising two injections of flu vaccine separated by an interval between 21 and 92 days;
- b) For boosters, the interval between two injections must not exceed twelve months.

2. For all horses whose primary vaccination was administrated after 1st January 2013:

- a) Primary vaccination comprising two injections of flu vaccine separated by an interval between 21 and 92 days;
- b) Booster to be administered 5 months later: the interval between two injections must not exceed 6 months;
- c) For the annual booster, the interval between two injections must not exceed twelve months.

In any case, the last injection must be done at least 7 days before arrival at the exhibition.

For equines under 1 year of age

Equine flu vaccination is mandatory: the "vaccination" sheet should include a stamp from a veterinarian who is not the owner of the animal.

A primary vaccination comprising two injections of flu vaccine separated by an interval between 21 and 92 days will be mandatory.

For foals born at the beginning of the year, subsequent booster at 5 months, with no more than 6 months between two injections.

In any case, the last injection must be done at least 7 days before arrival at the exhibition.

Equine Viral Rhinopneumonitis vaccination (Complete protocol) is recommended for all equines

Equine Viral Rhinopneumonitis vaccination is mandatory (Complete protocol) for equines participating in PRO FFE and SHF events.

Unweaned foals

- Description, birth certificate or the covering certificate of the mare.
- Electronic transponder is mandatory.

Failure to present all the elements described, duly completed and up to date,
the horse will be refused admission to the exhibition.

Veterinary service

A permanent veterinary service will be available during Equita Lyon opening hours.

Emergencies will be ensured 24 hours a day.

Any intervention will be at your expense.

As veterinary teams are at the disposal of all the equines present on the exhibition, please be aware that a veterinarian might not be immediately available on your arrival.
