THE RUN FOR A MILLION: THE CHALLENGE WHERE ANYTHING IS POSSIBLE

Five hundred thousand dollars! That's the incredible amount of prize money that France's Arnaud Girinon, the overall winner of The Run For A Million Final won in August 2025 in Las Vegas. One of the biggest amounts of prize money in the history of reining! And the competition appeals to all riders, because they don't have to be a professional to qualify, as it is open to amateurs! But before you arrive in Las Vegas, you'll have to give it your all, because only the sixteen best riders are selected at the end of the qualifiers held in the United States... and in Lyon.

WHAT IS REINING?

It is definitely the most popular Western riding discipline. Reining highlights the precision of the horse's dressage, its calm temperament and its responsiveness. Turning, speeding up, slowing down, and moving off again...The horse and rider combination must perform a series of standard figures: rollbacks, spectacular sliding stops and 360-degree spins. The aim is to perform each manoeuvre perfectly, with loose reins in one hand and aids that are as discreet as possible. Reining is the Western riding equivalent of classical dressage. The main difference is that there is a very special atmosphere at reining competitions: while the horse and rider are calm in the ring, the stands come alive with the spectators' cheers and 'yeehaws', creating a unique atmosphere!

THE OTHER WESTERN RIDING COMPETITIONS

At Equita's Western Area, reining takes centre stage, but it is not the only discipline on offer. During the five days of the exhibition, competitions take place in the Equita Lyon Western Horse Show's three arenas. The event will be interspersed by international, national and regional classes. Here is a short glossary to help you better understand the other disciplines that originated in the United States:

The European Barrel Racing Cup and Pole Bending

Pole Bending and Barrel Racing are two speed classes. In the first one, the horse must zigzag around six poles. In the second, it must go round three barrels using a cloverleaf pattern. Two classes where speed goes hand in hand with agility.

Performance and Super Horse classes

Performance classes are making a comeback at Equita Lyon in 2025! This year two American associations, the NSBA (National Snaffle Bit Association) and IRHA (International Ranch Horse Association) are once again organising various classes to test the horses' agility and technique, highlighting the qualities of the horses, their calm nature and their skill. Quarter horses, Paint horses and Appaloosas will be competing. So, horses with coloured coats will be to the fore in the Wyoming arena! The programme will also include a Super Horse competition, which combines several Western riding disciplines: Ranch Trail, Reining, Ranch Riding and Western Riding. As a result, the horses taking part are really versatile.

Ranch disciplines are attracting more and more interest because they are safe, yet technical, and suitable for all types of horses and riders. The classes are also very interesting to watch as they highlight the physical and mental qualities of American horses. The Equita Greatest Ranch Horse, a unique challenge, is back for the third time in Lyon! Ranch riding, ranch trail, ranch reining... and for the first time this year, a ranch rail class has been added. This is a ranch version of a Western Pleasure class. Fans of American horse breeds will be delighted, as the three main breeds will be represented once again.

THE EQUITA LYON WESTERN HORSE SHOW AND THE NRHA US: RENEWED TRUST

Since it hosted its first NRHA European Derby Final in 2017, the Equita Lyon Western Horse Show has gone from strength to strength, establishing itself as a must-attend event for Western riding in Europe, with the continent's most talented riders competing with their best five, six, seven and eight-year-old horses in Lyon. Buoyed by these years of successful collaboration and perfect understanding, a strong partnership has been forged between the teams in Lyon and the NRHA US, which governs reining at world level. In 2024, the NRHA US renewed its trust in the Equita Western Horse Show's teams by allowing them to organise the Euro Derby in Lyon for the next five years. This will be an opportunity for the steadily growing audience to continue to enjoy the incredible performances of the discipline's elite in the ring in Lyon.
